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Under a joint initiative of the European Union (EU), the United Nations Development Program (UNDP), and the State Agency for Vocational Education and Training, there have been started training on introducing inclusive learning at the vocational education level.

In the framework of the EU-funded project "Vocational Education for the Future", a training program on inclusive vocational education was implemented for the first time in the country.

The program to promote inclusion in vocational education was taught by Dr. Peter Grimes, a specialist with many years of experience in this field.

The three-day program included relevant training sessions for teachers, master trainers working in vocational schools in Baku, Ganja, Sheki, Jalilabad, and Lankaran, and explained the use of the pedagogical kits for training at the vocational education level for persons with disabilities.

Through training sessions, participants discussed inclusion, barriers, and solutions in vocational education and training, and received more information on organizing a universal learning environment.

It should be noted that the aim of the program is to promote inclusion in vocational education and to support the introduction of modern approaches in this direction.

This training program is organized in the framework of the project 'Vocational Education and Training for the Future: Supporting the Establishment of Advanced Vocational Education Centers in Azerbaijan', funded by the EU and implemented by UNDP in cooperation with the State Agency for Vocational Education. The main aim of the project is to support the organization of training in line with the demands of the labor market and to contribute to the modernization of vocational education and training institutions in Azerbaijan.
