The main objectives of the STEAM Azerbaijan project, which is being implemented in five regions of the country, including Barda, Lankaran, Tov Tov Uz, Shirvand and Sabirabade are STEAM education for female teteachers rand students rand the development of their idigital skills to

help them develop as qualified professionals in the future.

Within the framework of the project, 10 female teachers selected from ththe mentioned regions and 124 female students in the 15th 6th 7t7th and 8th grades were involved in training on mechatronics, 3D printing and modelling engineering, TinkerCAD, Micro bit modules at STEAM CenCentres time the mentioned regions. Indiaddition, the students who participated in the training were invited to a hackathon competition organised by the STEAM project.
